Notes from the director:

The aim is to provide a real theatre experience for our actor trainees. They are all quite incredible, from the youngest to the oldest. For many it is their first play. We've rehearsed the whole thing (largely) once a week at Monday night class (over 10 weeks), so this production is a short-term miracle.

About the plays – This strange programme of three short plays was inspired by the imagination of the students. *Wolf* was written in 2021 using improvisations & writings from the children, but sadly Covid19 curtailed our production. Three of those children are back this year, and with the addition of a couple of extra parts, *Wolf* (version 2) was born. This post-apocalyptic play reminds me of several TV series appearing on Netflix & the like.

Our adult actor trainees present *Industrial Art* & *School Camp*, two plays created after some improvised story-telling & a writing session with the students. Ironically some of the adults chose to act as children. Both plays have themes of pushing past obstacles, celebrating art, & finding resilience. They have a corny sit-com, sometimes soap-opera style. Enjoy.
